## SINGAPORE

The Republic of Singapore is located at the southern tip of the Malay Peninsula, comprising Singapore Island and several smaller islands. It sits at the crossroads of the Pacific and Indian Oceans, at the entrance of the vital shipping route through the Strait of Malacca.

Singapore is connected to Malaysia by the Johor Causeway, a 1.2-kilometer-wide link that allows passage for cars and trains. Covering an area of 618 square kilometers, English is the official language.

Singapore's economy is driven by entrepôt trade, finance, and shipping, with tourism also playing a major role. Today, Singapore is a beautiful, clean, and highly developed nation. The government actively encourages foreign talent to integrate into society, offering various incentives and a safe, stable, and conducive environment for talent and investors.

## WEATHER

Singapore has a tropical rainforest climate with temperatures ranging between 20°C and 32°C. It is warm year-round, with frequent showers providing temporary relief from the heat.

## ARRIVING IN SINGAPORE

Singapore Changi Airport is one of the world's best airports, featuring multiple terminals (Terminal 1, Terminal 2, Terminal 3, and Terminal 4).

Before arrival, make arrangements with your agent, family, or friends to meet you at the airport. Transportation is convenient, with options such as taxis, the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) system, and buses readily available.

## FORMALITIES

Upon arrival in Singapore, complete the necessary formalities as soon as possible, including:

- Reporting to your company or school
- Undergoing a medical check-up
- Visiting the Ministry of Manpower or Immigration & Checkpoints Authority to process your work or study pass

---

## OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

Once you receive your work or study pass, you can open a bank account by visiting a designated bank with your passport.

Major banks in Singapore include DBS, POSB, OCBC, and UOB, as well as international banks such as Bank of China, Citibank, Standard Chartered Bank, and Maybank.

## BRINGING MONEY

When arriving in Singapore, ensure you have enough cash or traveler's checks to cover essential expenses until you can open a bank account. Money changers are widely available for currency exchange.

### Estimated Budget for Your First Month (For Reference Only):

- **Accommodation:** 1-month deposit + current month's rent (S\$800–S\$1,200)
- **Meals:** S\$200–S\$250
- **Transportation:** S\$80–S\$150
- **Phone Bills:** S\$50–S\$80
- **Miscellaneous Expenses:** S\$100–S\$300
